

MAINTENANCE Instructions for Merchants with PM SUN

Merchants on **EAST Side of Street** and most Corner Bulbs)

■ **Lowest Height** ■ Medium ■ **Taller (2' maximum-SDOT regulation)**

BOTANICAL NAME	COMMON NAME	MAINTENANCE
Allium species	Ornamental allium-D	Add bulb fertilizer early spring and fall. Plant bulbs in fall
Arctostaphylos uva-ursi	Kinnikinnick-E	Prune as needed to keep off sidewalk
Aster x frikartii 'Monch'	Monch Aster-D	Prune to 1' high early summer to make full. Remove flowers when spent
Aster lateriflorus 'Prince'	Prince Aster-D	Prune to 1' high early summer to make full. Remove flowers when spent
Carex testacea	Orange Sedge-E	Orange color all winter, orange/green summer
Erysimum 'Bowles Mauve'	Bowles Mauve Wallflower-E	Cut off dead flowers 2 " below flowering stems to keep full
Escallonia 'Newport Dwarf'	Newport Dwarf Escallonia-E	Tip prune branches 3" to keep shrub full
Festuca glauca 'Elijah Blue'	Elijah Blue' Fescue-E	Finger comb out buff-colored grass in spring
Geranium 'Rozanne' or 'Biokova'	Biokova or Rozanne Geranium-D	Trim off dead flowers to encourage more bloom
Geranium macrorrhizum	Cranesbill-E	Trim off dead flowers to encourage more bloom
Helleborus argutifolius	Corsican Hellebore-E	Cut leafy branches to ground when flowers come in winter
Hebe 'Autumn Glory'	Autumn Glory Hebe-E	Tip prune branches 2" to keep shrub full
Hebe 'Patty's Purple'	Patty's Purple Hebe-E (+30' from a corner only)	Tip prune branches 2" to keep shrub full
Hebe albicans 'Red Edge'	Red Edge Hebe-E	Tip prune branches 2" to keep shrub full
Helictotrichon sempervirens	Blue Oat Grass-E	Finger comb out buff-colored grass in spring
Heuchara 'Green Spice'	Green Spice Coral Bells-E	Remove dead leaves and flowers when unattractive
Heuchara 'Palace Purple'	Palace Purple Coral Bells-E	Remove dead leaves and flowers when unattractive
Iris douglasiana	Pacific Coast Iris-E	Remove dead leaves and flowers when unattractive
Lavandula spp. or L. 'Hidcote'	Lavender or Hidcote Lavender-E	Cut off dead flowers 2 " below flowering stems to keep full
Prunus laurocerasus 'Mount Vernon'	Mount Vernon Laurel-E	Prune as needed to keep off sidewalk
Rhaphiolepis umbellata 'Minor'	Indian Hawthorn-E	Prune as needed to keep off sidewalk
Rosmarinus officinalis 'Irene'	Creeping Rosemary-E	Prune as needed to keep off sidewalk
Thymus d.'Bressingham' or T. praecox	Thyme-E	Trim back plant in early spring to keep full

These plants from the approved SDOT Streetside Garden Plant List. SDOT chose them for their hardiness, ease of maintenance, 2' maximum height, and drought tolerance—once established.

IMPORTANT: Annually spread all tree pits with 2 inches of compost in the fall or early spring.

Plants will need to be regularly watered for the first TWO years after planting and during dry periods in summer FROM THEN ON.
